The Honorable City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama reconvened into regular session, on the 6th day of June, 2016 at 7:07 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at City Hall.

Mayor Loxcil B. Tuck called the meeting to order. Mayor Tuck requested that Attorney Benjamin S. Goldman open the meeting, with prayer. Mayor Tuck asked Lieutenant Larry Rice to lead the pledge of allegiance.

**BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama** while in regular session on Monday, June 6, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

**Section 1.** That Resolution Number 7330, adopted October 18, 2010, in the amount of \$591.70; Resolution Number 7703, adopted October 11, 2012, in the amount of \$612.00; Resolution Number 7713, adopted December 3, 2012, in the amount of \$500.00; Resolution Number 7774, adopted May 23, 2012, in the amount of \$680.56; Resolution Number 7812, adopted August 19, 2012, in the amount of \$500.00; Resolution Number 7850 adopted November 4, 2013, in the amount of \$500.00; Resolution Number 7934, adopted July 7, 2014, in the amount of \$520.34; Resolution Number 7980, in the amount of \$500.00; and Resolution Number 8136, adopted October 15, 2015 in the amount of \$500.00 assessing the cost of abatements for the property located at 704 Jefferson Boulevard, Tarrant, Alabama, as provided in Ordinance Number 1017 are hereby amended,

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 8217**

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, June 6, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

**Section 1.** Having previously confirmed the applicable reports of costs on weed abatement, the City of Tarrant (“City”) elected to exercise its option to have the attached weed liens enforced under the authority of Section 11-67-66 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975), and the City Council did direct the City Clerk to give a copy of the attached weed liens to the Jefferson County Tax Collector, who, under the “Optional Method of Taxation,” is charged with the collection of the municipal taxes pursuant to Article 1, Division 2, Chapter 51, of Title 11 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975). Thereafter, pursuant to Section 11-67-66 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975), “It shall be the duty of the [Jefferson County Tax Collector] to add the costs of the respective weed liens to the next regular bills for taxes levied against the respective lots and parcels of land subject to a weed lien, and thereafter, the costs shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal ad valorem taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure under foreclosure and sale in case of delinquency; provided, however, that if the foreclosure and sale is the result of a delinquency caused by a weed lien, the municipality shall reimburse the county tax collector or revenue commissioner for all costs associated with the foreclosure and sale unless the costs are collected at the time of sale as part of the sale.”

**Section 2.** That said Resolution Number 8067 adopted Monday, June 15, 2015, regarding said property located at 1312 Sloan Avenue, Tarrant, Alabama, Parcel I.D. No. 23-00-05-3-013-004.000-RR-00 is hereby amended,

**Section 3.** Said resolutions shall be amended, as said assessment for Resolution Number 8067 in the amount of \$1,500.00 was appealed and said appeal granted by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama,

**Section 4.** A copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the current owner of said property.

Mayor Tuck asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak, in regards to these properties. Mayor Tuck closed the public hearing, as no one requested to speak.

Whereupon, Mayor Pro Tem Horton introduced the following proposed resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 8218

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TARRANT PURSUANT  
TO ORDINANCE NO. 1017 OF THE CITY OF TARRANT  
DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTIES A PUBLIC  
NUISANCE.

WHEREAS, an abundance of weeds and overgrown vegetation provide favorable conditions for the harboring of mosquitoes and other insects of like kind, and do otherwise have a negative impact on the health and safety of the citizens of Tarrant;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1017 of the City of Tarrant was designed to deter and provide for the abatement of weeds and overgrown vegetation;

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2016, a public hearing was held before the City Council of Tarrant, Alabama, to determine whether certain properties constituted a public nuisance by reason of overgrown grass, weeds, and/or other voluntary or spontaneous growth; and

WHEREAS, the appropriate notice called for in Ordinance No. 1017 was given to the person or persons in possession of, in ownership of, or in charge or control of said property, with respect to the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, as follows:

1. The properties on the list attached hereto as Exhibit "A" are hereby determined to be a nuisance by reason that the abundance of overgrown grass and/or weeds within the City is injurious to the general public health, safety, and general welfare by providing breeding grounds and shelter for rats, mice, snakes, mosquitoes, and other vermin, insects, and pests; that the height and dryness of said overgrown grass and weeds constitutes a serious fire threat or hazard; that said overgrown grass and weeds produces allergens that cause irritation to the throat, lungs, and eyes of the public; that said overgrown grass and weeds hides debris that could inflict injury on persons going upon the property; and/or that said overgrown grass and weeds are unsightly and in excess of twelve (12) inches in height.
2. Said nuisance shall be abated as provided for in Ordinance No. 1017 of the City of Tarrant, Alabama.
3. Those individuals abating the nuisance described herein shall render an itemized report in writing to the City Council showing the cost of removing the nuisance. Before the report is submitted to the City Council, a copy of the report shall be posted for at least five days prior thereto on or near the chamber door of the City Council, together with a notice of the time when the report shall be submitted to the City Council for confirmation.

8218. Motion for the adoption of Resolution Number 8218 was seconded by Councilmember Middlebrooks regularly put and upon roll call; the vote thereon was as follows:

The Recording Secretary announced the vote, whereupon Mayor Tuck declared Resolution Number 8218 duly and legally adopted.

Mayor Tuck recognized Mr. Elbert Leon Thompson of 1149 Westley Street, Tarrant, Alabama. Mr. Thompson stated that the Tarrant Post Office had changed its' name, to the Birmingham Post Office. Mr. Thompson stated that according to Federal Laws, it was a violation for any Post Office to change its' name, once it had been established. Mr. Thompson stated that he had documentation of the Post Office Codes and violations. Mayor Tuck asked Attorney Goldman to read the documentation, presented by Mr. Thompson. Attorney Goldman reviewed the documents and then asked Mr. Thompson where he had obtained the documentation. Mr. Thompson stated that he had looked it up, on the United Postal Service website. Mr. Goldman asked Mr. Thompson if he had seen the name posted on the building, of the Post Office recently. Mr. Thompson stated that he had driven by the post office to see what name was posted and it had been renamed Birmingham Post Office. Mr. Thompson stated that his concerns involved the addresses of residents in the City of Tarrant, being changed in the United States Postal Service database. Mr. Thompson stated that all of the addresses of residents in the City of Tarrant have been changed, to indicate that they live in the City of Birmingham. Mr. Thompson stated that this was causing problems with mailing addresses, due to the fact that Tarrant is no longer recognized as a city. Mr. Thompson stated that merchants could no longer use Tarrant as a city, due to the deletion that was made in the database, of the United States Postal Service. Mr. Thompson stated that merchants had to default Tarrant residences, to Birmingham. Mr. Goldman asked Mr. Thompson if he had talked with the Tarrant Post Office, about the problem. Mr. Thompson stated he had contacted the Post Office officials numerous times, with no result. Mayor Tuck stated that it was not unusual for a Post Office to provide service to several communities, who had the same zip code. Attorney Goldman added that this was not an issue that the City of Tarrant had any control over. Mr. Goldman stated that the United States Postal Service would have authority, over this matter.

Whereupon Mayor Pro Tem Horton moved that the meeting be adjourned. Said motion was seconded by Councilmember Anderson, regularly put and carried, whereupon the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
