

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA**

HELD ON MONDAY, APRIL 4, 2016

The Honorable City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama met in regular session, on the 4th day of April, 2016 at 7:00 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at City Hall.

Mayor Loxcil B. Tuck called the meeting to order. Mayor Tuck requested that Attorney Benjamin S. Goldman open the meeting, with prayer. Mayor Tuck asked Lieutenant Larry Rice to lead the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Loxcil B. Tuck stated that the Councilmembers had been provided with copies of the following minutes:

Mayor Tuck asked if there were any additions or corrections. The motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Horton and seconded by Councilmember Bryant, to approve said minutes as written, regularly put and upon roll call; the vote thereon was as follows:

The Recording Secretary announced the vote, whereupon Mayor Tuck declared the minutes approved and legally adopted.

Mayor Tuck stated that the *Ninth Annual Easter Egg Hunt* had been held on Saturday, March 26, 2016, at *Hewitt Park*. Mayor Tuck stated the *Easter Egg Hunt* had been successful, with a good crowd in attendance. Mayor Tuck stated that pizza had been served, instead of the traditional hotdogs and were well received. Mayor Tuck expressed thanks to everyone who had contributed to, or had taken part in the event.

Councilmember Middlebrooks introduced Ordinance No. 1087 as the second reading of said ordinance and read the proposed ordinance at length:

ORDINANCE NO. 1087

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SINGLE MEMBER VOTING DISTRICT FIVE BY ADDING CERTAIN ANNEXED PROPERTIES WITHIN DISTRICT FIVE

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama adopted Ordinance No. 1043 on March 26, 2012 amending Ordinance No. 942 adopted on October 6, 2003, amending Ordinance No. 812 adopted February 17, 1992 and amending Ordinance No. 768 adopted on January 4, 1988 (“Prior District Ordinances”), establishing that the city governing body of the City of Tarrant, Alabama shall consist of a Mayor and five councilmembers;

WHEREAS, under the Prior District Ordinances, That the Mayor for the City of Tarrant, Alabama shall be elected by the voters at large and the election of the five council members shall be by the Single Member District Method, and per this ordinance, this method shall not change;

WHEREAS, the Prior District Ordinances establish Tarrant City Hall, located at 1604 Pinson Valley Parkway, Tarrant, Alabama, as the central voting center for the election of Mayor and all Five (5) District Councilmembers, and per this ordinance, this method shall not change;

WHEREAS, the Single Member Voting District Map, attached hereto as Exhibit “A” hereof, was prepared by the Regional Planning Commission of Greater Birmingham and is attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance by reference, and per this ordinance, the ward lines of the Single Member Voting Map adopted by Ordinance Number 1043 on the 26th day of March, 2012, and per this ordinance, shall remain fixed as set forth in Ordinance Number 1043.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA, while in regular session this 4th day of April, 2016, as follows:

Section 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of said ordinance is to list all annexed properties which have been added to Single Member Voting District Five, since the establishment of the Single Member Voting District Map, adopted by Ordinance Number 1043 on the 26th day of March, 2012.

The property referenced by Ordinance Number 1056 is contiguous to District 5 – The referenced property is utilized as a business and will not affect District Lines

The property referenced by Ordinance Number 1070, lies within District 5 and will not affect District Lines

All referenced properties are contiguous to District 5 and shall have no impact on said District Five.

Section 2: **DISTRICT LINES SINGLE MEMBER VOTING DISTRICTS**

The City of Tarrant, Alabama is divided into Single Member Voting Districts- District 1, District 2, District 3, District 4, and District 5. The properties described in Ordinance Numbers 1056, 1070 and 1074 are all within District 5 and/or contiguous with District 5 and are not contiguous to any other Single Member Voting District. Additionally only one property is residential, that being 109 Springdale Road North, Tarrant, AL; Parcel I. D. Number 13 00 29 1 001 018.001. Said properties shall as listed and described herein and as illustrated on the Official Single Member Voting District Map are hereby adopted and made a part of this ordinance. The general boundaries of the respective Single Member Voting Districts shall remain fixed as set forth by Ordinance Number 1043, adopted March 26, 2012. The map displaying the Single Member Voting Districts of the City of Tarrant, Alabama shall be attached to this ordinance as Exhibit "A". It shall be filed in the Office of the City Clerk and shall show the date of the adoption of this ordinance. The ordinance and map shall, within five days of the date of adoption, be posted at: City of Tarrant in the Office of the Mayor, Tarrant City Hall, Tarrant Public Library, Tarrant Parks and Recreation Center and the Tarrant Board of Education.

Section 3. **CONSTITUTIONALITY AND VALIDITY**

Should any section, provision or part of this ordinance be decided and held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, provision or part of this ordinance.

A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR THE DEMOLITION OF A BUILDING OR STRUCTURE LOCATED AT 1534 EAST LAKE BOULEVARD, TARRANT, AL, PARCEL ID# 23-00-05-4-019-027.000, IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 4-115(F) OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 1022 OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on December 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. and after due deliberation the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama found that the structure standing at 1534 East Lake Boulevard, Tarrant, AL, Parcel ID# 23-00-05-4-019-027.000 was unsafe to the extent of becoming a public nuisance to the citizens of City of Tarrant, Alabama and was due to be condemned and demolished in compliance with Sections 11-40-30 through 11-40-36 and Sections 11-53B-1 through 11-53B-16, inclusive, of the Code of Alabama (1975), and Ordinance Number 1022 of the City of Tarrant, Alabama;

WHEREAS, issues have arisen with disposal of the anticipated demolition debris presently beyond the City's control;

WHEREAS, Ken Jones, the Building Inspector for the City of Tarrant, Alabama made a report to the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama recommending an extension of the time for demolition for a reasonable period of time as set by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2016, a public hearing was held before the City Council to determine whether to extend the time for demolition;

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, April 4, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama hereby extends the deadline for demolition of the structure standing at 1534 East Lake Boulevard, Tarrant, AL, Parcel ID# 23-00-05-4-019-027.000 until the 3rd day of June, 2016.

Section 1. Having previously confirmed the applicable reports of costs on weed abatement, the City of Tarrant (“City”) elected to exercise its option to have the attached weed liens enforced under the authority of Section 11-67-66 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975), and the City Council did direct the City Clerk to give a copy of the attached weed liens to the Jefferson County Tax Collector, who, under the “Optional Method of Taxation,” is charged with the collection of the municipal taxes pursuant to Article 1, Division 2, Chapter 51, of Title 11 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975). Thereafter, pursuant to Section 11-67-66 of the *Code of Alabama* (1975), “It shall be the duty of the [Jefferson County Tax Collector] to add the costs of the respective weed liens to the next regular bills for taxes levied against the respective lots and parcels of land subject to a weed lien, and thereafter, the costs shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal ad valorem taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure under foreclosure and sale in case of delinquency; provided, however, that if the foreclosure and sale is the result of a delinquency caused by a weed lien, the municipality shall reimburse the county tax collector or revenue commissioner for all costs associated with the foreclosure and sale unless the costs are a adopted Monday, June 15, 2015, regarding said property located at 1644 Burgin Avenue, Tarrant, Alabama, Parcel I.D. MUNICIPAL ELECTION SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 04/04/16, by and between Jefferson County Commission, political subdivision of the State of Alabama (hereinafter called "the County"), and the City of Parrant, (hereinafter called "the City"). WHEREAS, the City's Municipal election will occur on 08/23/16 and, if required, a runoff election will occur on 10/04/16; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to purchase certain election services from the County.

NOW, THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION OF THE ABOVE AND THE BELOW, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

SCOPE OF SERVICES: The Scope of this agreement is for County's General Services Department-Elections Division to provide election services for the above specified election which may include requested equipment and services as follows: ES&S DS-200 ballot tabulators, ES&S AUTOMARKS (voter assist terminals, for handicap voters), electronic ePollbooks (laptops for Election Day voter registration verification), voter privacy booths, tables, chairs, exteior "Vote Here" signage. Election services also includes ballot design and layout, equipment coding, assistance with equipment logic and accuracy testing, ePollbook data downloads, equipment delivery/pickup and Election Day support for the provided equipment. City is responsible for ballot proofing accuracy and authorization.

EXCLUSIONS: Ballot printing services and Election Day supplies are not included in this agreement. City shall make separate provisions for ballot printing and Election Day supplies.

MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS: The specified elections equipment may be used to conduct Municipal elections for cities which lie within the legal jurisdiction of Jefferson County Alabama

DELIVERY AND PICKUP OF EQUIPMENT: County has entered into a third party contractual agreement for delivery/pickup services of election equipment. The City clerk shall be responsible for coordination with the precinct's site contact person for the equipment deliveries/pickups.²⁴

²⁴*In addition to the delivery base rate listed above, the County will be reimbursed by the City an additional \$175.00 per each site for redelivery if the equipment cannot be delivered on the scheduled delivery date and time due to the fault of the City.*

INSPECTION: The County and the City shall jointly inspect each piece of equipment and note the condition of each item prior to the release of equipment to the City and again immediately upon return of the equipment to the County. The equipment shall be returned in the same condition it was in at the time of release. City shall be responsible for all repair or replacement cost for damaged equipment.

Whereupon, Councilmember Bryant moved for the adoption of Resolution Number 8203. Motion for the adoption of Resolution Number 8203 was seconded by Councilmember Anderson, regularly put and upon roll call; the vote thereon was as follows:

AYES: Councilmembers Anderson, Bryant, Horton, Matthews, Middlebrooks and Mayor Tuck

NAYS: None

ABSENT: None

The Recording Secretary announced the vote, whereupon Mayor Tuck declared Resolution Number 8203 duly and legally adopted. Councilmember Bryant stated that a copy of the contract was available, for those who wished to review it.

Mayor Tuck recognized Mr. Alvin Samples of 2046 East Lake Boulevard, Tarrant, Alabama. Mr. Samples stated that he had spoken with the City Council Members individual and as a group many times, during open meetings. Mr. Samples stated that this evening he had something to add tonight, but first he wished to thank Attorney Goldman for his prayer. Mr. Samples stated that the Tarrant Class of 1966 celebrated their 50th *Year Reunion*, on April 2nd at Grayson Valley Country Club. Mr. Samples stated that 150 to 200 people, had been in attendance. Mr. Samples stated that they had all had a great time, except for a sad event. Mr. Samples explained that Ronny Bradshaw had been placed on the agenda, for the opening prayer. Mr. Samples stated that Ronny Bradshaw's brother, Rick, had been with him. Mr. Samples stated that they had learned later in the evening that Ronny Bradshaw had been in an accident, but they had not known the details. Mr. Samples stated that the reunion had ended at 9:00 p.m. Mr. Samples stated that they had all received phone call at about 10:00 p.m., that Ronny Bradshaw had died at the scene of the wreck and his wife, Kay, had been air lifted to UAB. Mr. Samples stated that Kay Bradshaw is battling some uphill odds. Mr. Samples stated that he had wanted to say this, for a reason. Mr. Samples stated that Tarrant has a great history, of which those who have shared that history, could attest to. Mr. Samples stated, "Not just in my day, but for a long time." Mr. Samples stated that in his time, he had a great time at the Tarrant Schools. Mr. Samples stated that he felt everyone wanted to get back, to that point. Mr. Samples stated that we have to make some things happen - for that to happen. Mr. Samples stated that there is nothing magical about it. Mr. Samples stated that there are a couple of things that he would like for us to do, which go in the right direction. Mr. Samples stated that he is a tolerate man, more so than his wife. Mr. Samples stated that there is a point where tolerance is no longer, the right thing to do. Mr. Samples stated, "We as a City need to stop being so tolerate." Mr. Samples stated, "We need to stand up for what is right." Mr. Samples stated that in his area, people come by turning

on their music so loud, that it can be heard three blocks away and bounces off the walls of his home. Mr. Samples expressed again that he is more tolerate, than his wife. Mr. Samples explained that there are times that she can hardly handle it. Mr. Samples stated they have new neighbors, of which he knows the owner of the home. Mr. Samples stated that he and his wife have called the Tarrant Police Department at least ten times, regarding the neighbors. Mr. Samples stated that the new neighbors have a parked a car in their front yard, and have been working on it, for at least two weeks. Mr. Samples reported that there is also garbage and debris in their yard and the issue of loud music. Mr. Samples stated that his wife had asked them to turn the music down, but when she walked away, they turned the music back up. Mr. Samples stated that four or five days ago, he had an incident, which Lieutenant Rice responded to. Mr. Samples stated, "I have not said a word to these people. Mr. Samples stated, "When citizens are bombarded by those who have just moved in here, that's too far." Mr. Samples stated that the man came over to his yard/driveway and began to verbally attack him. Mr. Samples stated, "He does not know me from Adam, but let me say, he doesn't want to attack me." Mr. Samples stated, "I'm a nice guy, but he would have seen a different person." Mr. Samples explained that he had informed the man that he would not argue with him. Mr. Samples stated that he had told the man that he was violating our laws and ordinances. Mr. Samples stated that the man began to attack him and tell him all of his (Mr. Samples') problems. Mr. Samples stated that the man was the problem. Mr. Samples stated that Lieutenant Rice and several Police Officers responded and did a great job. Mr. Samples stated that the people were given four to six days, to clean up their yard. Mr. Samples stated that because they had stood up for what is right versus what is wrong, they straighten up their act, a little bit. Mr. Samples expressed frustration regarding: this business of tolerating everything, letting everything go, can't do nothing about this or that. Mr. Samples stated that he wish to say as a citizen to the City Council and to the Mayor, that we must stop doing that. Mr. Samples stated that we need to take a stand, for what is right versus what is wrong. Mr. Samples stated that as an example: the Noise Ordinance – the guy told him that he was not breaking any laws. Mr. Samples stated that he had asked him how long that he had lived here. Mr. Samples stated that the man had lived in Tarrant, for two months. Mr. Samples stated that he had lived in Tarrant, all of his life. Mr. Samples stated that the City does have an ordinance. Mr. Samples that Ms. Lynne had given him access to the ordinance and that he is familiar with the ordinance. Mr. Samples stated, "I would like to see us do something. Mr. Samples stated, "Let's put up signs up, such as City Ordinance, Noise Ordinance, etc." Mr. Samples stated that another issue is trash. Mr. Samples stated that there is trash front of this house and other places in the City, which also need to be cleaned up. Mr. Samples stated, "I am saying let's do

something, let's take a stand for what is right and what is wrong." Mr. Samples stated, "When someone is in the wrong, we do something about it." Mr. Samples stated, "I don't know what all the answers are, but I know you have to take a stand." Mr. Samples stated they had taken a stand and the people straighten up their act, because they know that they can't get by with it. Mr. Samples stated, "My thanks goes out to Lieutenant Larry Rice and the other Police Officers who responded; they did a great job." Mr. Samples stated that he had come to know the Police Officers and he commended them. Mr. Samples stated that they have a tough job, but will do the job, if you ask them. Mr. Samples stated that he had heard people talking about the trash. Mr. Samples stated, "Let's do something about it." Mr. Samples stated, "We all feel the same way, so let's do something about it." Mr. Samples stated that he had some suggestions. Mr. Samples stated that in the past he had made a lot of suggestions, but he really had not had any follow up regarding suggestions. Mr. Samples stated that he knew that City has had tax liens forever. Mr. Samples stated that for example people come here and say that they have bought property. Mr. Samples explained that James Phillips and the Street Department employees come in and cut the grass, the City pays for having the grass cut and then we forgive the lien. Mr. Samples stated that if we are going to forgive the lien, why spend the effort in cutting the grass; why not do something more useful. Mr. Samples stated that as a citizen, he is frustrated. Mr. Samples stated that he knew that most of the people who work for the City, do not live in the City. Mr. Samples stated that they have a different situation. Mr. Samples stated that is their choice and he was not saying that it is right or wrong. Mr. Samples stated, "I live here, many of us live here, so let's take a stand and try to do something. Mr. Samples stated that efforts should be made toward the Noise Ordinance, trash in yards and trash in the streets. Mr. Samples stated that in defense of the Street Department, who he has had issues with, from time to time; recently he saw all of the Street Department employees on East Lake Boulevard, picking up trash. Mr. Samples stated that trash was everywhere, but at the same time cars were coming by throwing more out trash, right beside the employees. Mr. Samples stated that beer bottles, whiskey bottles and fast food bags are thrown in his yard and it is frustrating. Mr. Samples stated, "I am showing you the frustration on purpose." Mr. Samples stated, "Many people feel this way and if you can do something about it, do it; I support you and I will help you." Mr. Samples stated that this is what he had wanted to put before the City Council. Mr. Samples stated that there are any number of things that could be done, but he had learned a long time ago that you have to be willing to do those things. Mr. Samples stated that if you are not willing to do those things and do them half-heartedly, it is hard for you to get that to go through. Mr. Samples stated that he would continue to come to meetings and would continue to support the City. Mr. Samples stated that Tarrant has a great history

and will still have a great future. Mr. Samples stated, "Please work together, do something positive and try to make a difference." Mr. Samples stated that if anyone is interested in suggestions or thoughts, that he had plenty. Mr. Samples stated that they might not be perfect, but he had plenty. Mr. Samples stated that these are his frustrations and the frustrations of the citizens. Mayor Tuck stated, "I do see your frustrations and we are just as frustrated, as you are." Mayor Tuck stated, "As you well know, we reduced our forces two years ago in order to stay alive and so that we could keep the City." Mayor Tuck stated that it is true the employees do not live in the City. Mayor Tuck stated that the City Employees have all worked hard, as if they did live in the City. General discussion followed. Mayor Tuck recognized Lieutenant Larry Rice. Lieutenant Rice stated that he understood the frustrations and sees it as well. Lieutenant Rice stated he had reported this evening, that the Tarrant Police Department had responded to 278 calls, since the last City Council Meeting. Lieutenant Rice stated that he felt that there is a lot more that can be done, not just the from the Tarrant Police Department, but as a community. Lieutenant Rice stated that as far as the people working in his department, there has been a turnover in employees. Lieutenant Rice explained that the employees see what the City is now. Lieutenant Rice stated that it is hard time to explain where the City was and that it does not have to be like this. Lieutenant Rice stated that recently he had distributed a packet, prepared by Attorney Goldman some time ago. Lieutenant Rice explained that the packet contained a list of the City ordinances and the enforcement options. Lieutenant Rice stated that he had asked Ms. Lena Yarbrough to attend a Tarrant Police Department roll call meetings, because she is very frustrated. Lieutenant Rice stated that in this way the Police Officers could place a face, with the person. Lieutenant Rice explained that he wanted the Police Officers to understand that there are people who have lived here for many, many years and enjoy the City, have seen the decline and also someone who is looking to move out. Lieutenant Rice stated that there are things that the Police Department is doing, so that the Police Officers are more in touch with the citizens and understand where they are coming from. Lieutenant Rice stated that in regards to cleaning up, the Police Department is focused on towing cars, cleaning up and things of this nature. Mayor Tuck stated that it is not the people living in the City that are throwing out trash, it is the people that are driving through. Mr. Samples stated, "I can say from my neighborhood, I was instrumental in helping you to decide to tear down some of those homes down." Mr. Samples stated that it had made it better, but there are many more just like them. Mr. Samples stated that what we all want, is for someone to want to live here. Mr. Samples stated that he was not saying that it would easy, he was saying that it would be tough. Mr. Samples stated that he felt that it is time, past time to try to make it better, and quick. Mr. Samples stated that Lieutenant Larry Rice does a great job

and the Tarrant Fire Department does a great job. Mr. Samples stated that he commends them. Mr. Samples stated that not everyone has enough courage, to face these people. Mr. Samples stated that they are afraid if they face up to them, they will be hurt or have a window broken. Mr. Samples expressed that this feeling is not a good place to be. Mr. Samples stated, "I would request that street signs be put up, that post our City Ordinances. Mr. Samples stated that there is a difference between trash in front of a house and being trashy, which bring rats and snakes. Mr. Samples stated that he and mostly his wife, have called about the neighbors and they have cleaned it up. Mr. Samples stated that you have to face it. Mr. Samples stated that it will not go away, if you don't face it. Mr. Samples stated that we have to take it one day at a time, one issue at a time and deal with it. Mr. Samples stated, "If we do that, I'd say great and let's just keep trying." Mr. Samples stated, "I am not trying to say that nobody is trying, but I am saying that there are issues, that I think could be done better."
