Mayor Wayman A. Newton called the meeting to order at 7:01PM following the council work session that began at 6:00PM to discuss items on the agenda and other matters.

The Springdale Road will re-open to traffic on Thursday, August 10, 2023.

First, Mr. Robby Pridmore, a registered nurse, spoke for an amputee who has problems paying for solid waste. Mr. Pridmore was referred to the City Clerk to discuss arrangements on qualifications for exemption from solid waste collection fees. Second issue is overgrown weeds on/near walkway of Tarrant Street, 2200 Block of old Pinson Hwy. Infrastructure needs improvement in this area.

Second, Karen Gordon and Amber Anderson concerned of an autowreck that happened in Tarrant City in 2022. The three cars involved were the result of an individual who was presumed to be driving under the influence. There are current issues of misplaced and/or lost evidence regarding the car wreck. The concerned individuals would like their specified information. Chief Major approached the Council and provided a detailed account of the 2022 accident.

Third, Jeromeo Jenkins concerned about electrical post in his yard that is having an effect on his electrical bill. Madam Mayor Pro Tempore Threadford will take the initiative of looking into Jenkins. Jenkins provided Mayor Pro Tempore with his personal phone number.

Fourth, Chuck Winborn provided view on 2022 City of Tarrant car accident regarding second public speaker. Mr. Winborn expressed concern regarding floor mats in the dispatch office. Floor needs to be replaced in the dispatch office, and it must be taken as a priority when considering future and/or immediate renovations.

Fifth, Allen Pilkington, formed group and need to know about Halloween funding for 2023. Question also in past parks and recreation initiative. Would like update.

Sixth, Will Smith, expressed concern on demolishing bathrooms at park. Volunteered that he and others will fix the bathrooms and preferred the Mayor and Council not to demolish the bathrooms at the park.

Seventh, individual expressed concern of storm water ditch.

Council discussed work session for storm water ditch and animal ordinance. August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 6:00PM set for work session with Storm Water Ditch and Animal Ordinance as items to be discussed.

There being no further business to be brought before the council, Councilor Threadford moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilor Bryant seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with all present being in favor.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:27PM.



**CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA**

**RESOLUTION NO. 9038**

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF TARRANT ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING JULY 1, 2023 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2024**

**WHEREAS**, the Superintendent of the City of Tarrant Electric Department (“TED”) find it in the best interest for the TED to adopt and operate pursuant to an operating budget for the full fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the Superintendent of the TED has prepared the attached operative budget (see Exhibit “A”) which has been reviewed by the City Council for said period reflecting anticipated revenue in the amount of \$8,350,500.00 and expenditures in the amount of \$7,912,816.04 including salaries and benefits in the amount of \$1,385,716.04, to be have been effective beginning July 1, 2023, and running through June 30, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, § 11-43-57 of the Code of Alabama (1975) provides for the following:

Annual appropriation of funds for expenditures of all departments and interest on indebtedness: In all cities, the Council shall appropriate the sums necessary for the expenditures of the several City departments and for the interest on its bonded indebtedness, not exceeding in the aggregate within ten (10) percent of its estimated receipts, and such City Council shall not appropriate in the aggregate an amount in excess of its annual legally authorized revenue. But nothing in this section shall prevent such cities from anticipating their revenues for the year for which such appropriate was made, or from contracting for temporary loans as provided in the applicable provisions of this title, or from bonding or refunding their outstanding indebtedness or from appropriating anticipated revenue at any time for the current expenses of the City and interest on the bonded and other indebtedness of the City.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, August 21, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

**Section 1.** The operating budget for the TED prepared by the Superintendent and submitted to the City Council be and is hereby approved and adopted to the extent of anticipated revenue of \$8,350,500.00, anticipated expenditures of, but not exceeding, \$7,912,816.04, including salaries and benefits in the amounts of \$1,385,716.04 and for interest on its bonded and other indebtedness not exceeding an aggregate amount of ten (10) percent of the estimated revenue; and

**Section 2.** The Superintendent is hereby authorized to expend the sum of \$7,912,816.04 in expenses, \$201,625.00 in debt service, and \$400,000.00 in capital improvements from the TED operating funds as expenses for the period that began July 1, 2023, and ends June 30, 2024; and

**Section 3.** A copy of said budget is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" and incorporated into this Resolution by reference as if fully set out herein; and

**Section 4.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

**Section 5.** Any expenditures made from July 1, 2023, until the adoption of this budget, that are contained in Exhibit A be and are hereby approved and ratified as if being made in accordance with this budget.



**Section 1.** The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein.


