CITY OF TARRANT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 2, 2023 TARRANT CITY HALL

The City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Monday October 2, 2023, at 7:00PM at City Hall.

Mayor Wayman A. Newton called the meeting to order at 7:03PM following the council work session that began at 6:00PM to discuss items on the agenda and other matters.

Reverend Gwen Webb lead those in attendance in the invocation. Tarrant City Fire Chief Patrick Bennett lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Newton asked for a roll call. The following officials were present during the roll call:

Councilor Freeman acknowledged the minutes to request and add that more recommendations and concerns were verbally referenced in ownest. After review, Councilor Threadford moved to approve the minutes from September 18, 2023 meeting as amended. Councilor Freeman seconded the motion. Mayor Newton called for a vote.

Next, the City Council heard from members of the public who had signed up to speak prior to the meeting.

First, Ms. Williams. Ms. William asked the City of Tarrant Mayor and Council about the house demolition and when the demolitions will begin. The Mayor responded by informing Ms. Williams that the process will begin with letters and that the owners will be given a time frame to respond followed by other legal steps. Ms. Williams responded on the need of immediate demolishing and expressed concern on the time frame it has taken in demolishing the abandoned and condemned homes in the City of Tarrant.

Second, Mr. Threat. Mr. Threat asked the City of Tarrant Mayor and Council about a possible abandoned building that is next to the Flats at Colebridge located at 851 Bell Avenue Tarrant, Alabama. Further, that unknown individuals are entering and leaving the building without consent or authorization. The Mayor informed Mr. Threat that the building is under the School Board and that a request will be made for Mr. Threat to appear at their future meeting.

Third, Reverend Webbs. Reverend Webbs advised and reminded the City of Tarrant Mayor and Council of patience that is needed in re-building the city.

Fourth, Mr. Miller. Mr. Miller publicly declared his respect for the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution. The speaker informed the City of Tarrant Mayor and Council about gunshots heard from outside his home on the Waverly neighborhood during the late Friday and Sunday nights of the previous days. Mr. Miller encouraged the Mayor and Council to address the gun shots heard by brainstorming future solutions to lessen possible 2nd Amendment abuse within the City of Tarrant.

This concluded public comments.

The City of Tarrant discussed concerns on the Public Works Department and the lack of City of Tarrant Police Officers. It was determined that a culture of outsiders come into the City of Tarrant to dump their trash. Council asked Chief Major to resubmit Camera request for problem locations in the City of Tarrant.

There being no further business to be brought before the council, Councilor Threadford moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilor Freeman seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with all present being in favor.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:51 PM

RESOLUTION NO. 9055

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF AN IRRIGATION SYSTEM FOR THE SOCCER FIELD AT FRANKLIN PARK.

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama ("City") is responsible for maintaining Franklin Park, a public park lying within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, at the park is a soccer field which the City uses to play its recreational soccer league as well as for other purpose commonly used by the citizens of the City; and

WHEREAS, a need has arisen to install an irrigation system on the field in order to insure any sod or seed placed down on the field is properly watered for maintenance and upkeep; and

WHEREAS, the City has received two quotes from area irrigation companies as to the best irrigation system and the costs and installation thereof; and

WHEREAS, having reviewed the quotes, Bibbs Landscape and Lawncare of Birmingham, Alabama, will meet the necessary specifications and requirements for the soccer field, with a total estimate of \$5,500.00; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section (a) of Act 2023-135 that became effective September 1, 2023, the threshold requiring competitive bids has increased from \$15,000.00 to \$30,000.00, thus eliminating the requirement that this purchase be competitively bid as the quotes are under \$30,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City finds it in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens to authorize the purchase and installation of an irrigation system for the soccer field and Franklin Park from Bibbs Landscape and Lawncare.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, October 16, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

Section 1. The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein.

Section 2. The City is hereby authorized to purchase and install the specified irrigation according to the terms in the quote from Bibbs Landscape and Lawncare that is

attached as Exhibit "A," and the City is authorized to expend funds in the amount of \$5,500.00 for said purpose which shall be paid from the City's General Fund.

Section 3. The Mayor or his designee shall be authorized to complete any necessary paperwork and authorization in order to complete the purchase.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

Exhibit B Terms and Conditions of Service

These Terms and Conditions of Service (the "Terms") govern the rights and obligations of Lexipol and Agency under this Agreement. Lexipol and Agency may each be referred to herein as a "party" and collectively as the "parties."

- Definitions. Each of the following capitalized terms will have the meaning included in this Section 1. Other capitalized terms are defined within their respective sections, below.

- 10.7 Notices. Any notice is quired here over shall be in writing and shall be made by certified mail (postage prepaid) to known, authorized recipients at such as tress as each party may indicate from time to time. In addition, electronic mail (email) to established and authorized recipients as each, trule when acknowledged by the receiving party.

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

A RESOLUTION SETTING DECEMBER 9, 2023, AS THE DATE FOR THE CITY OF TARRANT CHRISTMAS EXTRAVAGANZA, SETTING THE ROUTE FOR THE CHRISTMAS PARADE, AND AUTHORIZING CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS FOR THE CHRISTMAS EXTRAVAGANZA AND PARADE.

WHEREAS, traditionally the City of Tarrant, Alabama ("City") has held a Christmas holiday celebration and parade providing an opportunity for its citizens to come together during the holiday season in order promote closeness of the community and an opportunity to celebrate Christmas and New Years with other citizens; and

WHEREAS, for 2023, the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, ("City Council") will set Saturday, December 9, 2023 (with a "rain out" or alternate date of Sunday, December 10, 2023) between 4:00PM – 9:00PM as the date for the City of Tarrant Christmas Extravaganza and Christmas Parade; and

WHEREAS, a portion of Ford Avenue extending from its intersection at Pinson Street to the Ford Avenue intersection at Jackson Avenue will be used for street vendors, crafts, food trucks, holiday tables, and other type activities through the time of the Christmas Extravaganza; and

WHEREAS, the Christmas Parade will begin at 5:00PM and proceed along the route shown in Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, in order to allow and encourage pedestrian access to related events and celebration for the Christmas Extravaganza and for the health and safety of pedestrians and those participating in the Christmas Parade, the City Council finds it in the best interest of its citizens to temporarily close a portion of Ford Avenue, between Pinson Street and Jackson Avenue, for the Christmas Extravaganza along with the necessary set up and removal of any tents, vendors, or other obstructions along the street as well as temporarily closing certain streets along which the Christmas Parade route will proceed as shown in Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby authorizes the Chief of Police, or his designee(s), to close the streets for the aforesaid purposes beginning and ending at such times as the Chief of Police finds to best serve the set up and tear down of the participants in the Christmas Parade and vendors and participants in the Christmas Extravaganza.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Trussville, Alabama, while in regular session, a quorum duly assembled, on Monday, October 16, 2023, at 7:00PM the following:

- Section 1. The above-stated preamble is hereby approved, ratified, and incorporated as if fully set out herein.
- Section 2. The City Council of the City of Tarrant hereby declares Saturday, December 9, 2023, as the date for the City's Christmas Extravaganza and Christmas Parade. Alternatively, should a rain or other event force the cancellation of the Christmas Extravaganza and Christmas Parade on December 9, an alternate date of Sunday, December 10, 2023, is hereby set.
- Section 3. The City Council further authorizes the temporary closure of a portion of Ford Avenue between Pinson Street and Jackson Blvd. for the purpose of limiting vehicular traffic in order for the City's Christmas Extravaganza celebration to be held and safely allow citizens and those attended the celebration safe access along and through area during the course of the celebration along with the accompanying set up and tear down of all tents, tables, or anything else following the celebration.

Section 4. The City Council further authorizes the temporary closure of the streets shown in Exhibit "A" along which the Christmas Parade will travel on Saturday, December 9, or alternatively, Sunday, December 10.

Section 5. The Chief of Police, or his designee(s), is hereby authorized to direct the closure of that portion of Ford Avenue between Pinson Street and Jackson Avenue and for the streets shown in Exhibit "A" upon which the Christmas Parade will travel at a reasonable time before and after the Christmas Extravaganza and the Christmas Parade.

Section 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
