CITY OF TARRANT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES SEPTEMBER 4, 2024 TARRANT CITY HALL

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The City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, September 4, 2024, at 7:00 PM at City Hall.

Mayor Wayman A. Newton called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM immediately following the council work session that began at 6:00PM to discuss items on the agenda and other matters.

City of Tarrant Fire Chief, Patrick Bennet, lead those in attendance in the invocation. City Attorney Michael Brymer lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Newton asked for a roll call. The following officials were present during the roll call:

A quorum was determined to be present at the meeting.

The minutes from the August 19, 2024 regularly scheduled council meeting were presented for review and approval. Council Threadford noted correction on page 3 of 5 in reference to motion Resolution No. 9202 that the word 'Appointing' be substituted to 'Re-Appointing' and that the word 'New' be removed. Mayor Newton also requested that addition of 'individual charged the council dais' during public comments speaker number one. Council Threadford also requested at bottom of page 4 and top of page 5 that 'the individual was being provoked' also for public comments speaker number one. Councilor Threadford moved to approve the minutes with the amendments for September 4, 2024. Councilor Bryant seconded the motion. Mayor Newton called for a vote.

The yeas being four (4) and the nays being zero (0), with one (1) member not voting, the motion to approve the minutes were adopted, and the minutes for August 19, 2024 council meeting were approved with the amendments.

The Mayor stated that the Storm Water Management Plan Draft link will be posted on the City of Tarrant webpage for 7 days to retrieve public comments input. The Mayor encouraged the public and the City Council to provide comments and suggestions when the link is posted. If there are no public comments or suggestions then the Draft will be submitted to the County for adoption. The Mayor also acknowledged and publicly thanked the Sheriff Pettway for coordinating the

arrests and confiscations of two shootings at Brummitt Heights that occurred within the past two to three weeks.

Councilor Freeman requested to go on record and informed that the City Hall needs to inform Blue Print Properties that trash bins are needed at their Apartment Complex, more specifically Apartment Complex 1113 on Elm Avenue, and 2221 and 2215 of Evergreen Street need street lights, cameras are needed in this area as well. Speed bumps needed at 2323 Treadwell, 3004 Grove Avenue, and 1738 Enfield Street. Councilor Freeman verbally provided Blue Print Properties business phone number. Councilor Freeman ended by reading a letter of complaint to the City of Tarrant delivered to her and provided by an anonymous individual. September 14, 2024 Traffic Light Celebration to be held at Brummit Heights. Councilor Freeman thanked and acknowledged City of Birmingham Councilmember JT Moore and Mayor Woodfin for the help in ensuring the traffic lights were installed.

Councilor Threadford informed all those in attendance that the City of Tarrant Electric Department will be accepting applications. Application intakes will be prioritized in accordance with City of Tarrant Residence and Business Proprietors. Reshonda McNeal will be coordinating and providing the application process for the City of Tarrant Electric.

Councilor Freeman also informed all those in attendance that the Coca Cola company are currently taking in applications for drivers.

There were no committee reports.

The Mayor and Council moved on to Old Business.

Next, Councilor Threadford introduced and read Resolution No. 9207, A Resolution Authorizing the Personnel Board of Jefferson County to Create a Classification System and Pay Schedule for All Tarrant Electric Department Employees. Councilor Threadford moved to approve Resolution No. 9207. Councilor Bryant seconded the motion. Mayor Newton requested to go on record that if there is a surplus and items are purchased with increased wages that City of Tarrant citizens are financially strained with power bills, and that this must be taken into consideration. Councilor Threadford advised the Mayor to meet with Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) in response to negotiating and reaching an agreement in lowering the Electricity bills in the City of Tarrant. Mayor Newton agreed to call TVA. Mayor Newton called for a vote.

Councilor Bryant moved to approve Resolution No. 9208. Councilor Threadford seconded the motion. Mayor Newton requested to go on record that the City has no guaranties the board of education will give the City credit for the almost \$100k expended by the City to bring the old high school football field ready for use. The mayor emphasized his concern with taking action to approve any agreement with the board of education without some written guarantee from the board of education to give the city credit for the amount expended to get the field ready for play. Councilor Threadford responded that the City Council had already approved the football field letter use agreement at a prior meeting. The matter before the council is the Use Agreement for the Tarrant City Bord of Education to use the City's rec center gym and the City's baseball / softball

fields. The City Attorney Michael Brymer was questioned regarding the Use Agreement and the matter currently pending before the council. Mayor Newton referenced section 2 of Resolution No. 9208, and number 5 of the User Agreement. Mayor Newton called for a vote.

In providing the account, Mr. Winborn informed all those in attendance that the business license was later revoked due to a zoning error for the original business application license. Mr. Winborn asked the Council to reinstate and find a way for the business proprietor to resume his business without conflict in the City of Tarrant. Mr. Winborn also reminded all those in attendance of the numerous vacant businesses in downtown Tarrant.

Second, Scott Tidwell introduced himself as a new Proprietor in the City of Tarrant. Mr. Tidwell provided a brief account of his most recent positive and negative experiences in developing and building his rental business with the City of Tarrant.

Next, Councilor Threadford asked the Chief of Police to approach the podium in response to the recent Sheriffs co-ordinations with the City of Tarrant. The Chief of Police expressed his views on an Tarrant Police Department employee who could not perform service duties due to lack of payment from the City of Tarrant. There was debate and conflict on the hiring and terminating processes and court outcomes.

There being no further comments from the public, the Mayor entertained a motion to adjourn. Councilor Threadford made a motion to adjourn. Councilor Bryant seconded the motion. A verbal vote was taken. Meeting ended at 8:13 pm.

RESOLUTION NO. 9187

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF THE SALARY OF THE CITY MANAGER, REINSTATEMENT OF ALL BENEFITS PREVIOUSLY PROVIDED TO THE CITY MANAGER, AND DIRECTING BACK PAY OF ANY SALARY AND BENEFITS TO THE CITY MANAGER.

WHEREAS, on or about June 5, 2023, the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, ("City Council") by Resolution 9019, pursuant to Ordinance 1154, appointed and hired John Brown as city manager; and

WHEREAS, the appointment and Mr. Brown's authority to hold office of the city manager was challenged by State ex rel. Deanna Ceasor v. John Brown, 01-CV-2023-907397.000 (John Brown v. State of Alabama ex rel Deanna Ceasor, Alabama Supreme Court Docket No SC-2024-0066); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Judge Ballard's order dated June 6, 2024, the execution of the judgment of the court is stayed pending appeal of the matter to the Alabama Supreme Court which has the effect of allowing Mr. Brown to remain as city manager until disposition of the appeal or may otherwise be ordered by the court (a copy of the order granting the stay of execution of the judgment is attached as Exhibit 'A' to this Resolution); and

WHEREAS, as Mr. Brown has continued his work as city manager but has yet to be paid, the City Council finds Mr. Brown is entitled to, since the circuit court order is stayed pending the disposition of the appeal or as may be otherwise ordered, reinstatement of his salary, benefits, reimbursement for out of pocket expenses related to the case or his job, and back pay from the date of the order of stay to present, and directs the city to pay same to Mr. Brown as soon as practical.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, while in regular session a quorum duly assembled on Monday, September 16, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. a quorum being duly assembled as follows:

Section 1. The above stated preamble is hereby approved, ratified, and reinstated as if fully set out herein.

Section 2. Pursuant to the circuit court's order staying its final judgment pending the disposition of the appeal in the styled matter, Mr. John Brown is entitled to resume all salary payments, benefits, out of pocket expenses, including bond amount, and

back pay from the date of the order staying the circuit court's judgment (e.g., June 6, 2024) through present, and shall continue all payments due to Mr. Brown for his continued employment as city manager until the disposition of the appeal or which may be otherwise ordered by the circuit court or supreme court.

Section 3. The City shall, through its normal payroll operations and pursuant to policies, remit payment to Mr. Brown of the salary, benefits, out-of-pocket expenses including bond amount, and back pay as soon as practical. Any payments shall be subject to all tax and other withholdings as required.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

WHEREAS, following the findings of an April 2024 independent investigation into the Office of the Chief of Police of the City of Tarrant, which revealed multiple areas of serious misconduct on the part of Chief Wendell Major, the City Council of the City of Tarrant has continually declined to remove Chief Major from office; and

WHEREAS, since the April 2024 report said misconduct has continued and / or escalated, exposing law enforcement officers, the citizens and the City of Tarrant to serious name and

WHE (EAS, this ongoing misconduct includes: (a) continual closing of law enforcement cases are tening and / or obstructing active investigations (including cases which involve domestic and) or gun violence); (b) retaliation in violation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; (c) allowing uponthorized personnel unsupervised access to sensitive and confidential areas of the Public Safety Building (including former employees who were terminated for misconduct); (d) hings ersonnel outside the rules, policies and procedures as outlined by the Jefferson County Personnel Board and (e) approving contracts, services and / or expenditures without prior authorization; and

WHEREAS, based on the findings of misconduct from the April 2024 independent investigation and the current, ongoing misconduct and the current to law enforcement officers, citizens and the City of Tarrant, Chief Wendell Majo is due to be removed from the Office of the Chief of Police of the City of Tarrant forces experience.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, while in regular session a quorum duly assembled on Monday, September 16, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. a quorum being duly assembled as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the City Council of the City of Tarrant does hereby immediately remove, for cause, Wendell Major from the Office of the Chief of Police for the City of Tarrant by a majority vote of those elected to the Council.

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE CONDITIONS AT 1265 ETOWAH STREET AND DIRECTING ACTION WITH RESPECT TO THE CONDITION OF THE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, following a Public Hearing, the City Council finds the real property located at 1265 ETOWAH STREET, in the City's corporate jurisdiction, has maintained on the property an unlawful amount of overgrown grass and weed vegetation in violation of Chapter 9, Article 1 Section 9-17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Tarrant; and

WHEREAS, notice to abate the nuisance on the subject property was supplied to and received by the identified property owners and, to date, said property owners have not taken any action to remove the sign as provided in Chapter 9, Article 1 Section 9-17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Tarrant or otherwise bring the sign into compliance with the cited ordinance (see Exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted the Council under Chapter 9, Article 1 Section 9-17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Tarrant Code of Ordinances, the Council adopts this resolution ordering the above-described overgrown grass and weed vegetation to be remediated and/or removed by the authorized city official.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA while in regular session a quorum duly assembled on September 16, 2024 at 7:00 pm. as follows:

- 1. The City Council finds that the overgrown grass and weed vegetation at 1265 ETOWAH STREET constitutes a violation Chapter 9, Article 1 Section 9-17 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Tarrant.
- 2. The authorized city official shall remove the above-described overgrown grass and weed vegetation and assess any and all costs of the overgrown grass and weed vegetation removal against the property owner as prescribed under the Ordinance.
- 3. Further, the authorized city official shall cause this resolution to be provided to the property owner(s) under this Ordinance.

WHERBAS, on July 24, 2024, the circuit court issued an order and judgment affirming the Chief of Police as the appointing authority for the TPD (see copy of order Exhibit "B"); and

WHERBAS, on or about September 6, 2024, the Personnel Board of Jefferson County ("PBJC"), by and through its executive director, Dr. Jeff Crenshaw, recognized the Chief of Police as the appointing authority for the TPD (see attached correspondence from PBJC attached as Exhibit "C"); and

WHEREAS, there remain pending certain police officer personnel actions with the PBJC that need to be resolved through formal hearings, settlement, or otherwise, and the City Council finds it appropriate, in consideration of the foregoing, to authorize the Chief of Police to resolve or direct to resolve all pending personnel actions pending before the PBJC through formal hearing on the merits, settlement, or otherwise.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, while in regular session a quorum duly assembled on Monday, September 16, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. a quorum being duly assembled as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Thea above stated preamble is hereby approved, ratified, and reinstated as if fully set out herein.

Section 2. The Chief of Police, as the recognized appointing authority of the TPD is hereby authorized to resolve or direct to resolve any and all pending police personnel actions, with the PBJC.

Section 3. The Chief of Police is authorized to take any and all actions reasonably necessary to effectuate the intent and purpose of this Resolution. Further, the

Chief shall, upon completing any resolution of the current police personnel actions pending with the PBJC, shall make written report of the pending cases and the outcome of those cases to the City Council.

Section 4. The Chief of Police's authority to resolve these pending personnel actions shall be limited only to those personnel actions pending from all current or former police officers and no other employees with the City of Tarrant.

<u>Section 5.</u> The City Clerk shall submit an executed and certified copy of this resolution to the PBJC upon its adoption.

Section 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 1162

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND CREATING THE CITY OF TARRANT ALABAMA POLICE DEPARTMENT.

SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "City of Tarrant Alabama Police Department Ordinance" and shall be codified as determined by the editor of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Tarrant.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of the City of Tarrant Alabama Police Department is to protect and to serve the residents and visitors of the City by maintaining public order, deterring crime, investigating criminal activities, and upholding the laws and ordinances of the City, the laws and Constitution of the State of Alabama, and the laws and Constitution of the United States of America.

SECTION 3. CREATION OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

- A. Under the authority granted to the Council in Alabama Code § 11-43-55 (1975), the City of Tarrant Alabama Police Department is the primary law enforcement agency for the City.¹
- B. The Police Department is responsible for enforcing local, state, and federal laws within the City limits.

SECTION 4. ORGANIZATION AND STRUCTURE

A. The Police Department shall consist of the following divisions or units, which may be modified as deemed necessary by the Chief of Police:

- 1. Patrol Division;
- 2. Investigations Division;
- 3. Special Operations Division;
- 4. Administrative Division;
- 5. Dispatchers; and
- 6. Corrections.

B. Under Alabama Code § § 11-43-5 and 11-43-55 (1975), the Chief of Police shall be appointed by the City of Tarrant Alabama City Council and shall be responsible for the general supervision of the City of Tarrant Alabama Police Department. Nothing in this paragraph, however, is intended to affect any rights the Mayor has under the Alabama Code or to remove any rights of the Mayor under Alabama law.

Alabama Code § 11-43-55 (1975): "Except as otherwise provided in this title, the council shall have power to establish a police force and to organize the same under the general supervision of the chief of police, and to provide one or more station houses and to require all things necessary for the maintenance of an efficient police department."

SECTION 5. POWERS AND AUTHORITY

- A. Officers of the Police Department shall have the authority to enforce all applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations within the City at the direction, and under the supervision of the Chief of Police duly appointed by the Tarrant City Council in conformity with the laws of the State of Alabama and the rules and regulations of the Alabama Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission ("APOST"). Nothing in this paragraph, however, is intended to affect any rights the Mayor has under the Alabama Code or to remove any rights of the Mayor under Alabama law.
- B. The Police Department members having been certified as sworn law enforcement officers by the APOST, holding such certification and having been recommended to the City Council by the Police Chief of the City of Tarrant, shall have the power to make arrests, conduct investigations. and use reasonable force when necessary to carry out their duties, in conformity with applicable Alabama State Laws and Constitution of the State of Alabama and the Constitution of the United States.
- C. All Officers of the Police Department selected and appointed shall be from a list of eligibles provided by the Personnel Board of Jefferson County, Alabama ("PBJC"), consistent with its rules and regulations and subject to PBJC jurisdiction.

SECTION 6. RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

- A. The Police Department shall be responsible for, at minimum, the following:
- 1. responding to emergency calls and maintaining public safety:
- recording such calls and reports of public safety concerns and regularly report same to the City Council on a monthly basis;
- 3. the Chief of Police shall serve as the City's custodian of all police records and any record generated by any officer or employee of the Tarrant Police Department;
- 4. investigating and preventing criminal activities:
- 5. collaborating with other law enforcement agencies:
- 6. providing community outreach and engagement programs;
- 7. maintain and operate a jail or similar such facility to house individuals ordered held by the Tarrant Municipal Court or any Court of competent jurisdiction:
- 8. register monitor and report the registration of convicted sex offender in compliance with state and federal law
- 9. acquire, assign, account for, store all equipment owned operated and used in the ferreting out of criminal violation of the City:
- 10. maintaining records and documentation in accordance with legal requirements;

- 11. the Police Chief in cooperation with the City Attorney shall promulgate rules, regulations, policies, and procedures and shall timely submit same to the Tarrant City Council for ratification and implementation of those rules, regulations, policies, and procedures:
- 12. any other activity or duty routinely handled by a police department within the state of Alabama and for which the department is authorized to handle by state and federal law; and
- 13. any other duty or requirement as may be directed by the City Council that the Police Department is lawfully permitted to take.

SECTION 7. BUDGET AND FUNDING

A. The City of Tarrant Alabama City Council shall allocate necessary funds for the operation and maintenance of the Police Department through the annual City budget. The Chief of Police shall be responsible for creating a budget on an annual basis and submitting same to the Mayor and the City Council for consideration.

B. The Police Department may receive funding from state and federal grants, as well as other sources, to enhance its capabilities and services. All such funds shall be held by the City of Tarrant pursuant to its normal financial accounting practices.

SECTION 8. REPEALER

Any and all provisions in an existing ordinance of the City of Tarrant Code of Ordinances that conflicts with or are contrary to any term or provision in this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed. Specifically, but not limited to, any provision in section 2 – 1 of the City of Tarrant Code of Ordinances that is contrary to or in conflict with this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Any part, section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or word which may be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction shall not affect or otherwise alter the remainder of the Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon its adoption, approval, and publication or otherwise provided for by law.





- 7. This Order disposes of Case Number 01-CV-2023-904087 in its entirety and, therefore, the Court hereby severs Case Number 01-CV-2023-904087 from Case Number 01-CV-2024-901091.
- 8. The only issue remaining in Case Number 01-CV-2024-901091 is whether Plaintiff WENDELL MAJOR is entitled to an award of attorneys' fees. RE: Recognition of Appointing Authorities

Mayor Newton, City Council, & Police Chief Major:

As you are aware, the Personnel Board has historically recognized the Mayor as the Appointing Authority for Classified positions within the City of Tarrant. Personnel Board Rule 1.3 has defined an Appointing Authority as follows:

Appointing Authority. Any person, officer, board, council, commission or other governmental body whose lawful jurisdiction or powers are confined wholly or primarily within the territorial limits of Jefferson County and who or which possesses final power to appoint persons to services, jobs, offices or positions, the compensation of which is paid in whole or in part from the public funds of Jefferson County or from the public funds of a municipality in Jefferson County subject to this Act. Except as otherwise provided by law, the Board will consider the mayor to have final decision making authority on behalf of a municipality.

In light of efforts made by the City Council to modify the Appointing Authority for certain Classified positions through adopted City ordinance and recent orders issued by Judge Ballard in Case Number 01-CV-2023-904087 (see attached), the Personnel Board has modified its recognition of the Appointing Authority for certain City positions. This letter is intended to clarify these changes and the manner in which the City must proceed for execution of all actions requiring Appointing Authority approval.

Appointing Authority for City of Tarrant Classified Positions

Police Chief & Fire Chief Positions

The Personnel Board views the positions of Police Chief and Fire Chief to be Classified positions under its Rules & Regulations (henceforth referred to as "the Rules"). As previously communicated in correspondence on June 21, 2024 to Mayor Newton and the City Council through Mayor Pro Tempore Tracie Threadford, consistent with Judge Ballard's court order on May 20, 2024 upholding the Tarrant City Council's authority under Section 11-43-55 of the Alabama Code, the Personnel Board

recognized the City Council as the Appointing Authority with respect to the employment of a Police Chief and Fire Chief. Although the City executed a change to the Appointing Authority for these positions, nothing about this change should be viewed as medifying the rights of these positions or the occupying employees provided under Act 248, H. 580 of the Alahama Legislature of 1945 or the Rules.

All employment actions for these positions requiring approval of the Appointing Authority under the Rules and Personnel Board processes shall be executed within Workday (i.e., the Personnel Board's human resources system) by a single member (which may include the Mayor) designated by the Council. At this time, Ms. Threadford as Mayor Pro Tempore is established as that member in Workday; however, this may be modified at the desire of the Council, ideally through a properly adopted ordinance. It should be noted that the single member will have no individual authority to take any employment action on either of these positions within Workday. For any employment action initiated in Workday for either of these positions, the action must be accompanied by an appropriately adopted ordinance of the Council outlining the desire to take such action. Failure to include such ordinance in support of the action, will lead to the action being denied by the Personnel Board.

Municipal Clerk Position

Pursuant to Sections 11-43-3 and 11-43-4 of the Alabama Code, the Personnel Board has historically viewed the City Council as the Appointing Authority for of the Classified position of City Clerk (also referred to as Municipal Clerk) for all Merit System municipalities. Despite the fact that the Personnel Board has historically recognized the City Council as the Appointing Authority for this position, the execution of employment actions for this position within effectively functioning municipalities has been through the Mayor authorizing the employment actions for City Clerk on behalf of the Council. The lack of effective cooperation among and between the Tarrant Council and Mayor has necessitated a change to this process. As such, as with the aforementioned Chief positions, the Personnel Board will require that the Council designate, through a proper ordinance filed with the Personnel Board, a single Councilmember (or Mayor) to take any employment action on this position within Workday. Again, no action entered into Workday by the designated individual will be approved by the Board absent an appropriate ordinance outlining the desired action on the part of the Council as a whole. Any other positions within the City Clerk office and/or reporting to the City Clerk will be treated in accordance with the section on "All Other City Positions" presented below.

Police Force Positions in the Police Department Other than Police Chief

Through his July 24, 2024 Order, Judge Ballard recognized Tarrant City Ordinance 1162 as valid and established the Police Chief as the Appointing Authority for positions within the Police Department effective July 1, 2024. In accordance with this Order, the Personnel Board recognizes the Police Chief as the Appointing Authority for police force positions designated within the Police Department. All employment actions for police force positions within the Police Department requiring approval of the Appointing Authority under the Rules and Personnel Board processes shall be executed within Workday by the Police Chief (or his/her authorized designee) and shall require no further approval of the Council or Mayor. Although the City executed a change to the Appointing Authority for these positions, nothing about this change should be viewed as modifying the rights of these positions or the occupying employees provided under Act 248, H. 580 of the Alabama Legislature of 1945 or the Rules. Also, the Personnel Board recognizes the active appeal of this Circuit Court's decision and, should the aforementioned order be reversed based on that appeal, the Board will modify its recognition of the Appointing Authority accordingly.

All Other City Positions

The Personnel Board retains recognition of the Mayor for all other positions of the City of Tarrant not listed above. All employment actions for these positions requiring approval of the Appointing Authority under the Rules and Personnel Board processes shall be executed within Workday by the Mayor (or his/her authorized designee) and shall require no further approval of the Council.

Responsibilities of the Appointing Authority

It is the responsibility of the Appointing Authority to be fully aware of, and comply with, the requirements for executing and processing employment actions in accordance with the Personnel Board Rules & Regulations. No actions will be processed by the Personnel Board without appropriate authorization and the Personnel Board will not be responsible for delays or denials of employment actions due to the failure of the Appointing Authority to properly execute actions or provide appropriate authorization. The City of Tarrant shall be responsible for supplying payroll files in a timely fashion as required by the Personnel Board for proper review and certification of payroll.

In order for the various Tarrant Appointing Authorities to initiate employment actions and for the Personnel Board to appropriately monitor those actions, the Personnel Board must reconfigure its Workday system to reflect the appropriate reporting patterns and approval workflow. The City of Tarrant has not maintained a functional organizational chart within Workday. In order to finalize the appropriate Appointing Authority reporting structure, it is necessary for the City of Tarrant to supply a legitimate and correct organizational reporting structure for all current positions and employees. I am requesting that each of the Appointing Authorities provide an organizational structure for all positions under their authority. Once these are received, the Personnel Board will finalize configuration of the positions in Workday and initiation of employment actions by the Appointing Authorities for their designated positions may be executed.

Other Internal City Disputes

The Personnel Board has no authority to resolve other disputes arising out of the execution of the City's operations under the Appointing Authority structure established by the City of Tarrant.

Resolution of such disputes shall be the responsibility of the City and respective Appointing Authority(ies). Failure to resolve any such disputes shall not be viewed as a legitimate basis by any Appointing Authority for failing to comply with any Personnel Board process or Rule.
